Chronically Sick and Disabled Persons Act 1970

The Chronically Sick and Disabled Persons Act (CSDPA) 1970 places a specific duty on local

authorities to provide the support which a disabled child is assessed as needing when it comes within the scope of the CSDPA. This will include arrangements for the provision of assistance for an eligible disabled child for adaptations to their home, or the provision of any additional facilities designed to secure greater safety, comfort or convenience.

The Chronically Sick and Disabled Persons Act 1970 required local authorities to provide welfare services to disabled people who fell within section 29 of the National Assistance Act 1948 (those who were blind, deaf, people with learning disabilities or mental illness and disabled people).

The result in the final Children and Families Act is the amended section 37(2)(e), which states that an EHC Plan must specify 'any social care provision which must be made for [the child or young person under 18] by the local authority as a result of section 2 of the Chronically Sick and Disabled Persons Act 1970...'.

CSDPA - the mystery duty for disabled children's social care

NOTE: The Chronically Sick & Disabled Persons Act (CSDPA) 1970 now only applies to children in England Or you're incapacitated and housebound because of a chronic long-term illness or disability, which stops you leaving the house without help (for example, if you're on the National Organ Transplant waiting list).
